


#### WELCOME TO THE NOTABLY NSW ISSUE OF KC

Tamsin shares some of her personal thoughts below about the on-going flooding in her area.

I'm in Murwillumbah . . . After days of flooding, we are the lucky ones. . . our house didn't flood. . . only cut off for days. But I have friends who have lost everything except the clothes on their back. Before the floods we had no internet for a month due to an unexplained Telstra outage. It's been such a difficult time recently with all the floods here . . . So many feeling that they just can't seem to catch up at all. Then the deluge! Roads washed away. It took 5 days to be able to just reach my horses. I couldn't drive there and had to walk through water and the washouts carrying food. We had no power, internet or phone coverage for days. My daughter was flooded out at a friend's house for 5 days too.

Then more flooding just last week with the internet out again for a week. This year has been so difficult for so many people

I feel so grateful for the fact we have everything. . . but also completely over the damp and mold on everything!! Thank God we have internet back now. And the sun is shining. — Tamsin Ainslie






