




WELCOME to the final issue of *KC* for 2025.






WHY I LOVE series (Puffin/ Penguin Random House Books, Australia)

WHY I LOVE WORKING WITH MICHAEL WAGNER

It is always a pleasure to get to work with Michael on another project. When you receive a text with Michael. He has always thought very carefully about how things could look. His manuscripts always include a great deal of visual material and research. I love this. I don't know if he does this research to help him with the writing side of things...I will definitely ask the next time I see him.

Although there is always a great deal of research done for the book, this shouldn't be confused with Michael being in

any way prescriptive on how the illustrations should look...quite the opposite - he is

always (I think...) happy to see what my response to the text might be (Though that research really does come in handy!)

This is our third 'Why I Love' book we have done together. It is always fortunate when a book spawns a series, or at least a couple of sequels. We certainly didn't plan this when we did 'Why I Love Footy' ten years ago, so it is always good to check in with this family every few years...mind you, like The Simpsons, this family doesn't seem to have aged at all in those ten years...maybe they all take place in the same year...

In some of the larger scenes in *Why I Love Christmas*, there were many great opportunities to add some tiny details that seem to be common at this time of the year. This is something I love about being an illustrator. There are details from my family Christmases, including particular dishes and foods, as well as long lunches spent in the backyard. Absolute bliss.

I love Christmas time, and I love the week spent between Christmas and New Year's, reading the Christmas books you may have been lucky enough to have been given. Books make the best presents. There is something special about sharing the joy you get from a particular book or author and being able to spread that joy around a bit. ~TOM



WHY I LOVE CHRISTMAS by Michael Wagner

Okay, the rumours are true. I do love Christmas. I really do. So, writing down all the things that make Christmas so special for me felt WONDERFUL. And it also made me feel lucky and grateful. Here's why.

Why I Love Christmas is the third book in our 'Why I Love' series, following on from Why I Love Footy and Why I Love Summer. Writing each book involved me sitting at my desk thinking lovely, grateful, happy thoughts. That was the job! Not many jobs are anywhere near that enjoyable. Most jobs are just hard work. And you never get paid for sitting around thinking happy thoughts. But I did for these three books, and that is what makes me feel so lucky and grateful.

The series began a few years ago when I sat at my computer and, for no good reason, wrote **Why I Love Footy**. The whole story tumbled out in hardly any time at all. But I never thought it would become a book. I just wanted to write it. So, I did.

Then, when it was finished, I showed it to my wife, Jane Godwin (she's also a children's author), and said, 'That'll never be a book, right?' To my surprise, Jane thought it could be a book because it came straight from my heart.

It was what creative people call 'authentic' meaning I'd written what I truly feel and believe. And when you write something that's truly what you feel and believe, it's got a pretty good chance of being made into a real book... because it's authentic.

So, I sent *Why I Love Footy* to my publisher, and it was made into a book. Then, to my surprise, it became popular, so I started thinking about writing more books about other things I love. The problem is, there are so many things in the world to love. For me, there's my family, my friends, my home, my city, my country, many different sports, listening to music, writing stories, and more.


But what came out next was **Why I Love Summer**. I think that's probably because it was winter and I was really looking forward to some warm weather and family holidays. I couldn't turn up the temperature in the actual air, but I could in my mind.

Then, because people also liked *Why I Love Summer*, I suddenly found myself writing about the most precious, lovely, warm-hearted time of the whole year, Christmas. That meant, thinking about all the traditions we take part in as a family: making gingerbread houses with the cousins; going to carols by candlelight; having turkey and pudding for a big family lunch on Christmas Day; and many other things. It was lovely to remember all of those things and put them all into *Why I Love Christmas*.

So that's how the 'Why I Love' series came about. I'm not sure if Why I Love Christmas is the last book in the series, or if another idea is going to sneak up on me in the future, but I'm happy either way. It's been a lovely spending so much time thinking about my favourite parts of life and why they bring me so much joy. And it all began because I just wrote something from the heart that I truly felt and believed.

Maybe you could do that too. Right now. Can you think of something or someone you love and then come up with six things you love about them? I bet, if you do that, you'll soon feel just as lucky and grateful as I do whenever I write a 'Why I Love'...book. ~ MICHAEL


COVER DESIGN IMAGE

This spread inside the book was eventually adapted into a single page for the back cover design of **Why I Love Christmas**.

This involved adding some more to the top and bottom of the image in order to fit it into the square format.

Why I Love Christmas isn't the only Christmas book I have illustrated. The fourth book in my Aussie Baby's First Words series, following on from Dinner Time, Bed Time, and Bath Time, is Christmas Time. For very very young readers...or storytime with Mum and Dad, this board book for babies illustrates some of the traditional things you see at Christmas time, but with more of an Australian flavour. Aussie Christmases feel very unique, we have inherited a lot of Northern

Hemisphere traditions but have turned that into something very Australian. I hope I have been able to convey this very 'Australianness' in both 'Why I Love Christmas' and 'Christmas Time'. (Both make EXCELLENT Christmas gifts by the way.....) ~ TOM







Although there are recurring objects and items in 'Why I Love Christmas' and 'Christmas Time' the illustrations look very different. Different audiences or age groups will sometimes determine how you draw and colour things.

For 'Christmas Time' this is a word book for babies, so we just need to illustrate the word on each page, with as little distraction and often very very simplified to reinforce the understanding between word and picture.

'Why I Love Christmas' is for a more older reader, and as well as reading the text with themselves or with a parent, there is much detail for the reader to hopefully find new things and encourage multiple reads! ~ TOM
















BOOK COVER SAMPLES and DESIGNS

These are examples of cover sketches or rough layouts.

Here, I'm trying a few different elements, and even tweaking the design a little.

The aim was to make it sympathetic with the other two Why I Love books which feature our narrator, Mitch, and his Dad. So, eventually, this decided the design for us.

I submit roughs like these to the book's editor who will then take them to the publisher's covers meeting. At this meeting, many people, including those in the marketing sections, decide what will work best for the cover. I'll generally submit 8-10 different options, and the editor will let me know which one they have decided on. Sometimes, a request may come back asking for a more detailed rough of one or two of the ideas. ~ Tom




STORIES AND CHARACTERS **EVERYWHERE**
